OUSIN OF J. RUTTLEDGE, ADJUTANT GENERAL IRA 1928

MAYO-native, Dr. John A. Madden, M.D., who played a leading role in the War of Independence in Co. Mayo, died at the age of 58 years, at his residence, 20 Lower Baggot St., Dublin, in September, 1954. Born in Gortleatilla, Glenamoy, Ballina, he was educated in St. Muredach's College, Ballina, U.C.G. and U.C.D. After graduation in 1919he was appointed Medical Officer in Pullathomas, North Mayo, and soon after joined the West Mayo Flying Column under General Michael Kilroy, Newport, and subsequently became Brigadier for North Mayo. In 1922, on the establishment of the Garda Siochana he was appointed the new force's Medical Officer at Garda H.Q. He was later appointed Assistant Surgeon at Mayo County Hospital, Castlebar. He was elected a Sinn Fein member of Dail Eireann for North Mayo in 1924 and 1927. Donnelly.
